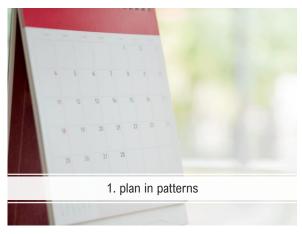

- · daily movement break or wellness break
- 15-minute review game on Fridays
- · Mondays: quick writes at the top of the hour
- · choice boards: 2 consecutive days during each unit
- · Friday "First Fifteen": content-related kiddie lit
- · all units begin with an interactive notebook review

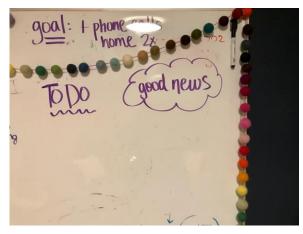
Are there ways your planning can become more predictable so that it is quicker/easier and easier to coordinate with planning partners?
